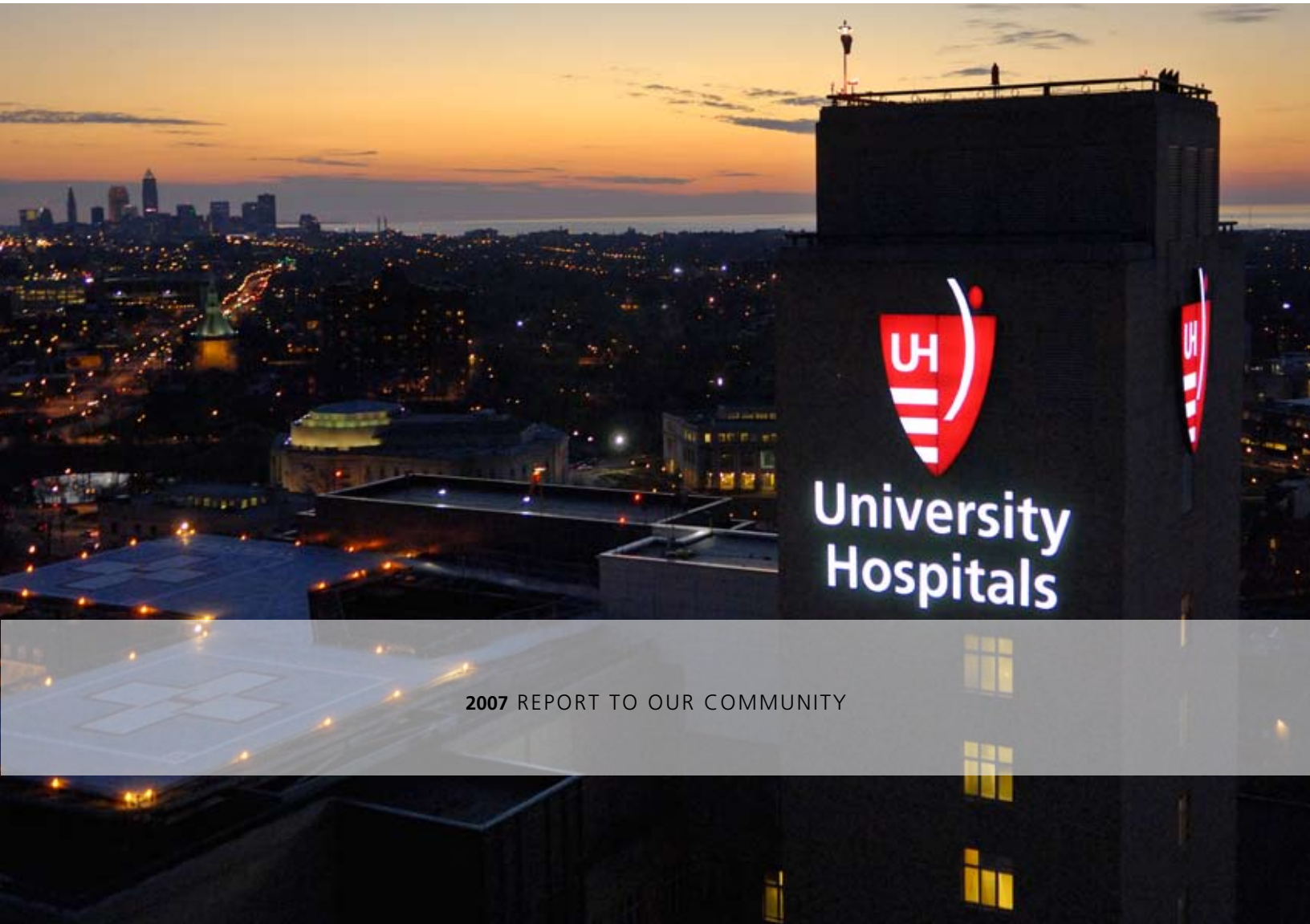

Together, these programs will help to ensure our continuing progress in the years to come, as we set higher health care standards and become increasingly worthy of emulation by medical centers around the world.

Dear Friends,

This 2007 Report to Our Community is both a chronicle of the past year – one of the most successful periods in our history – and a preview of the future of University Hospitals.

In these pages, we look back at 2006 and the important steps taken to realize our Vision 2010 strategic plan and implement our new branding initiative, and how these two programs are – quite literally – changing the face of UH.

As part of our new brand position that was unveiled last year, UH will continue to provide the highest quality patient-centered care in state-of-the-art facilities staffed by internationally recognized medical professionals. We can continue to fulfill our vision by building on the solid foundation of fiscal responsibility. Our 2006 financial performance was the best in UH's history as our operating and non-operating income exceeded \$120 million. At the end of 2006, Moody's Investors Service changed our outlook to "positive" and maintained our "A3" bond rating. Two weeks later, Standard and Poor's Rating Service also upgraded our bond outlook to "positive" and maintained our "A" rating.

In 2006, our supporters nurtured UH with unprecedented foresight and generosity. The largest individual gift in UH history came in December, when Monte Ahuja – founding Chairman and CEO of Cleveland's Transtar Industries, Inc. – and his family announced a \$30 million donation to support Vision 2010. In recognition of their unparalleled philanthropy, the new hospital being built in Chagrin Highlands will be named the UH Ahuja Medical Center.

This extraordinary gift by the Ahujas raised our total support for 2006 to more than \$100 million, making this our most successful philanthropic year in our 140-year history. The Rainbow Babies and Children's Foundation was

recognized with the Samuel Mather Award, UH's highest philanthropic honor, for the largest gift in Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital's history – \$20.6 million to help fund construction of the new Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and support other Rainbow programs. The Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation committed \$10 million for the new NICU and The Neurological Institute. The Leonard and Richard Horvitz families committed \$5 million as a leadership gift to create The Marcy R. Horvitz Pediatric Emergency Center. In addition, the Murdough Foundation awarded \$5 million to our Department of Dermatology, the largest gift for dermatology in the United States. And, the Key Foundation donated \$1.5 million for a major diversity initiative and construction of our new freestanding cancer hospital.

Yet the faith exhibited by donors and the ratings improvements we received are born out of our commitment and unsurpassed ability to care for our patients. UH Case Medical Center was once again recognized for clinical excellence in 13 specialties by U.S. News & World Report magazine's annual rankings of America's Best Hospitals, and Rainbow remained the No. 1 pediatric hospital in the Midwest. In addition, UHCMC was named one of the top 50 hospitals in the United States in the annual Quality and Safety Survey of the Leapfrog Group, a national coalition of employers and healthcare-purchasing organizations. UHCMC was also selected as a Solucient 100 Top Hospital – an annual award that is given to the highest performing hospitals in the nation and is based on five critical areas: clinical outcomes, patient safety, operational efficiency, financial stability and growth in patient volume. Finally, HealthGrades, the country's leading independent healthcare ratings company, bestowed

its highest five-star ratings on 15 of our specialty areas at UHCMC. Throughout this report, you will read more about the achievements by our physicians and other caregivers.

Also in 2006, we reached the most comprehensive agreement in our century-long relationship with Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine. This new agreement defines a primary affiliation between our institutions and unites the academic, research and clinical aspects of the affiliation under one shared medical campus, the Case Medical Center. This affiliation agreement enhances our ability to recruit and retain the best physicians, investigators and top medical students and residents.

The public and private grant support for our research initiatives, particularly our collaborative efforts with the School of Medicine, continued in 2006. UH and the School of Medicine received the largest share of funding in Ohio from the National Institutes of Health, and, perhaps most significantly, our NIH support increased over the previous year despite the fact that NIH funding nationwide has remained flat.

Finally, we join with everyone in the UH family to express our profound thanks to George M. Humphrey II, who was presented with University Hospitals' first Honorary Lifetime Board Member Award upon his retirement after more than 25 years of service on our board of directors. In recognition of the significant role that Mr. Humphrey has played in continuing his family's legacy of support, the Humphrey Family and the UH board established the George M. Humphrey II Chair in Neurology.

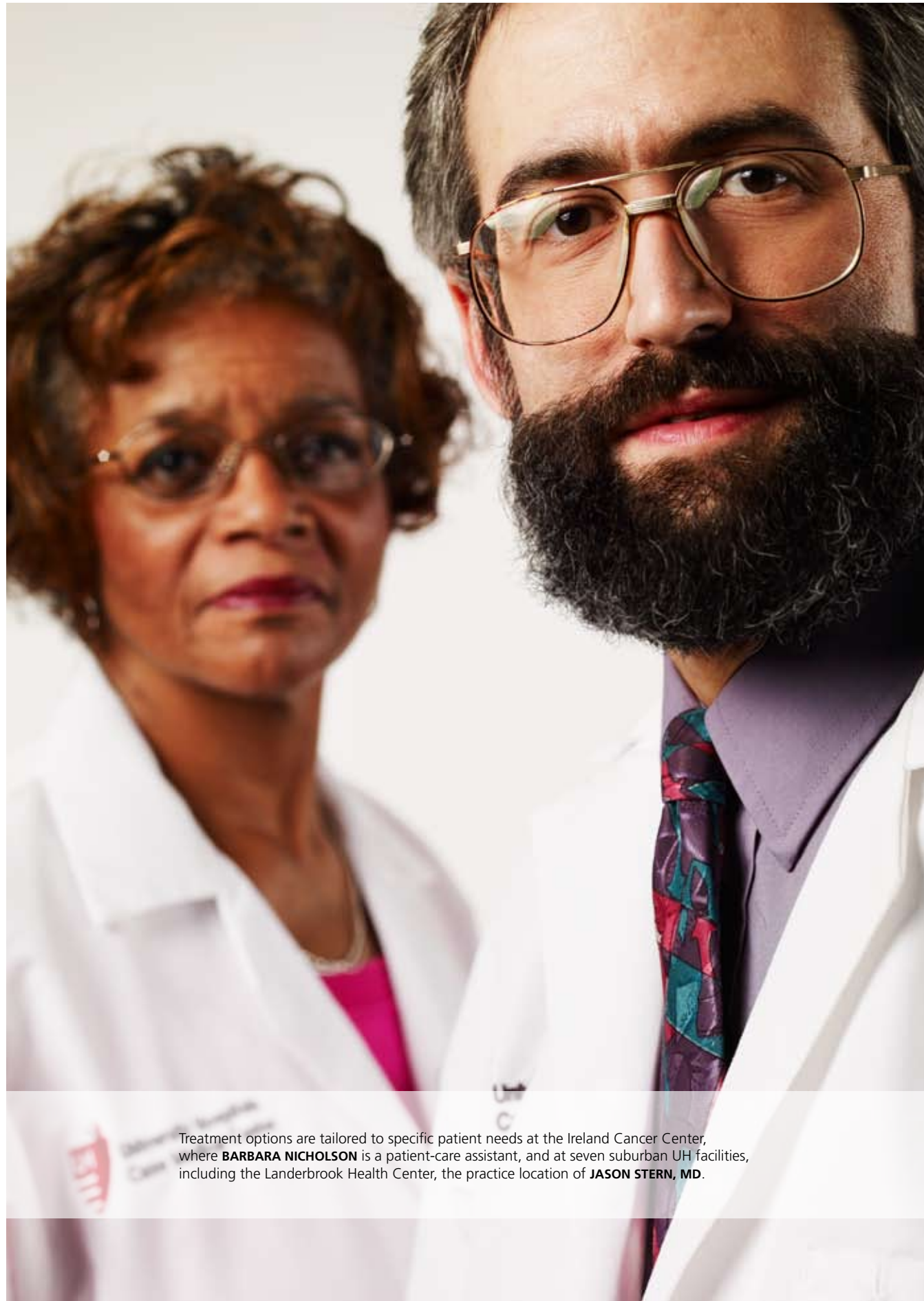
This has indeed been a defining year for University Hospitals. We thank you all for your unwavering support, and we invite you to join us as we create an exciting and fulfilling future.



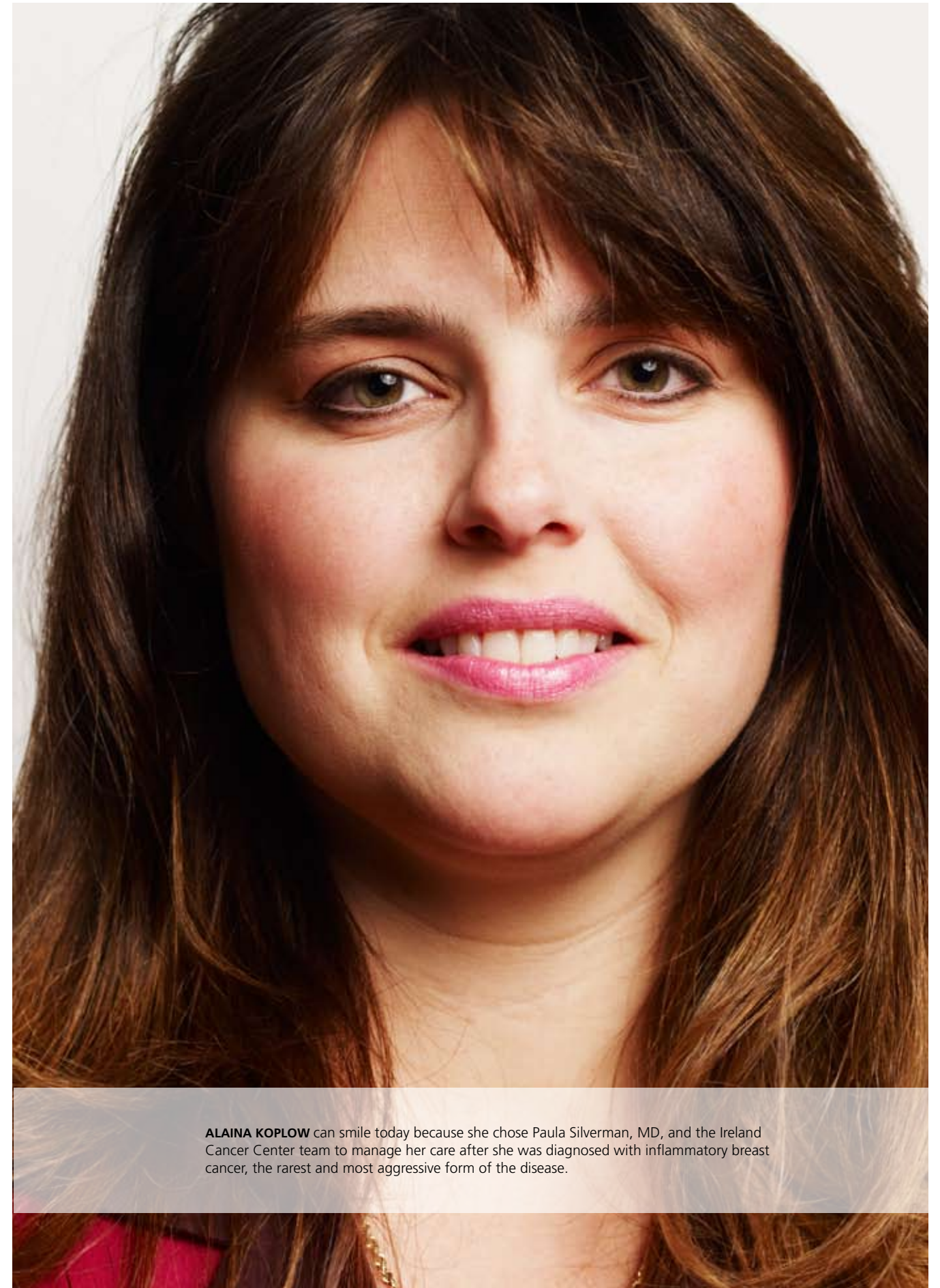

THE NEW FACE OF PATIENT-CENTERED CARE

More than a year ago, University Hospitals set out to determine a strategy to strengthen and build on our brand – that is, the public perception of our institution. The work began with extensive market analysis within the communities we serve, as well as internal discussions among board members, physicians, employees and senior management. Our goal was to discover the multitude of reasons why patients prefer UH and which of our attributes they find unique and compelling. From these appraisals came a clearly delineated and cohesive statement of our core values and our mission going forward, as well as strategies for ensuring that the UH brand would be immediately recognizable locally, regionally and nationally.

The comprehensive initiative we subsequently launched in September 2006 is intended to sustain, enhance and disseminate to the widest possible audience the UH brand – a reputation for compassionate, patient-centered care that is underpinned by clinical excellence, groundbreaking research and advanced medical education.

The key elements of our brand comprise our core values: excellence, diversity, integrity, compassion and teamwork. These are coupled with an institutional mission that demands continuous pursuit of superior clinical outcomes and a focus on the individual that, when working in concert, result in highly personalized patient care.

Today, all of the facilities, programs and services of the former University Hospitals Health System are unified under a single designation: “University Hospitals,” the name by which our extended health care network has always been most readily recognized by patients and physicians.

We also launched a new Web site (www.UHhospitals.org) that conveys our brand and incorporates a more vibrant system approach. As we move forward, we are adding many interactive components to the site that will help people access our physicians and services conveniently online.

Finally, the most prominent element of the branding initiative is our new logo, a striking visual image that embodies four key messages:

- The color red communicates boldness and confidence;
- The shield symbolizes protection, strength and the academic dimension of our work;
- The three horizontal bars represent our historic tripartite mission: “To Heal. To Teach. To Discover;”
- The stylized “face” of the curved line and dot designates the human element of the equation – our commitment to excellence for the benefit of patients, their families, physicians, researchers, employees and the communities we serve.

The new logo is a bold and forward-looking statement that reflects the qualities of our institution. Through design and color it communicates our promise of excellence to patients, to colleagues, to employees and to the medical community as a whole.



THE SHAPE OF THINGS TO COME

Implementation of our Vision 2010 strategic plan has begun. The largest transformative endeavor in our history is already changing the face of the institution, in terms of both physical structures and program initiatives.

Made possible by operational improvements and a sound fiscal policy put in place over the past two years, Vision 2010 is an investment in the future and a commitment to take us to the next level of excellence in patient-centered care, leading-edge research and state-of-the-art medical education. More than \$1 billion is being invested over five years to meet the anticipated requirements of patients, physicians,

employees and communities in the dynamic, ever-changing environment of modern medicine.

Ground was broken in July for the new UH Twinsburg Health Center, which late this year will offer general and specialized primary care for adults and children, as well as an urgent care center and radiology, laboratory and physical-therapy services.

Planning is also underway for a remarkable new suburban facility to open in 2010 – the UH Ahuja Medical Center in Beachwood. The medical center will start with 200 beds and eventually expand to a 600-bed hospital. In addition to the hospital, the health campus will have an ambulatory surgery

center and physician offices and education and community outreach capabilities. The facility is intended to complement the outpatient services currently provided at UH Chagrin Highlands Medical Center, which is located directly across I-271 from the Medical Center.

On the UH Case Medical Center campus in Cleveland's University Circle, a major renovation and expansion of adult and pediatric emergency services is underway. A new 54,000-square-foot Center for Emergency Medicine will open in 2009, enhancing the level of patient care for both children and adults by providing a centralized facility with a substantial increase in emergency beds and state-of-the-art diagnostic and laboratory services.

Nearby will be a new, 150-bed freestanding cancer hospital – a \$200 million project that will consolidate the current resources of Ireland Cancer Center and radiotherapy, chemotherapy, mammography, surgical oncology and allied services. Distinct clinical areas for specific patient needs will be housed in an environment conducive to personalized care as well as to the promotion of research and physician education.

By the summer of 2008, Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital's new 38-bed Neonatal Intensive Care Unit will be the largest and most technologically advanced facility of its type in

Ohio. The new unit – incorporating both a Level III NICU and a 44-bed Neonatal Transitional Care Unit – will provide state-of-the-art diagnostic and treatment facilities in a homelike setting that even offers parents the option of sleeping at their child's bedside.

All of our new facilities will feature private rooms, while existing semi-private rooms in current buildings will be converted to private rooms over the next five years. New parking facilities will be added at the suburban locations and the University Circle main campus. A major investment is being made to introduce Electronic Health Records technology system-wide, which is expected to enhance communication among care givers, improve ease of access by patients' physicians and, ultimately, lower costs.

Vision 2010 is a bold and forward-looking statement of our commitment to bring the most up-to-date, patient-centered care to the communities we serve.



CARDIOVASCULAR CARE

University Hospitals Case Medical Center is one of only 12 medical centers in the country recognized by the American Heart Association for consistently meeting their highest standards of care in patients with coronary artery disease and heart failure. And our stature as a premier provider of state-of-the-art cardiovascular care was further enhanced during 2006 when we established the UH Heart & Vascular Institute.

The new institute is designed to unify our approach to the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of heart and vascular disease, as well as to enhance research efforts in the field and accelerate the translation of new discoveries from the research lab to the clinic.

A multidisciplinary team of physicians and nurses specializing in ambulatory cardiology, advanced heart failure and transplantation, electrophysiology, cardiovascular imaging, interventional cardiology, heart and vascular surgery and congenital heart disease discusses a patient's medical situation as a group and reaches consensus for evaluation and the best treatment plan for the patient.

The new Institute is led by director Daniel I. Simon, MD, FACC, FAHA, FSCAI, who joined UH in 2006 from the Harvard Medical School and Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, and co-director Adnan Cobanoglu, MD, who also joined UH in 2006 from the Turkish Advanced Specialization Hospital in Ankara, Turkey. Dr. Simon serves as chief of the UH Division of Cardiovascular Medicine and holds the Herman K. Hellerstein Chair in Cardiovascular Medicine. He is developing new approaches to restenosis (renarrowing of arteries after angioplasty), and his lab has identified a molecule whose presence can predict imminent heart attacks and strokes in high-risk patients, a discovery that may lead to a preventive blood test. Dr. Cobanoglu currently serves as professor and Chief of the UH Division of Cardiac Surgery and previously held positions as professor and chief of cardiothoracic surgery at the Oregon Health Sciences University.

Administratively, Robin Rowell, RN, CNP, recently appointed Vice President of the Heart & Vascular Institute, will provide oversight of planning, growth, development and operational management of cardiovascular services. She has

been with UH for 16 years and was previously director of Administrative Cardiology.

Building on the Institute's multidisciplinary approach, UH is expanding heart and vascular services at UH Geauga Medical Center and investing nearly \$11 million in extensive renovation and new construction for dedicated cardiovascular centers at UH Richmond Medical Center and UH Bedford Medical Center as well as ambulatory sites in Euclid, Mentor, Twinsburg and Westlake. Each of the suburban locations will offer the same high level of compassionate, patient-centered care as that available at UH Case Medical Center, with the most advanced diagnostic services available, comprehensive rehabilitation programs, specialized nursing care and thorough patient education that addresses both immediate health issues and the emotional and lifestyle factors that are important in the prevention of heart and vascular disease.

NEUROLOGICAL CARE

University Hospitals inaugurated the Neurological Institute in 2006 as Northeast Ohio's first integrated team of specialists devoted to the diagnosis and treatment of diseases and conditions affecting the nervous system. Institute programs cover the entire human lifespan – from prenatal to geriatric – and employ a unique interdisciplinary approach to personalized patient care that provides access to the latest treatments and procedures, many of which are derived from ongoing research protocols.

The most advanced neurosurgical procedures are performed in the nation's first operating room dedicated to neurosurgery with intra-operative monitoring. UH specialists were the first in North America to perform Deep Brain Stimulation of the thalamus to treat symptoms of Tourette's Syndrome successfully. The Neurological Institute is the first unit in Ohio to offer the full suite of stereotactic radiosurgery—including Gamma Knife® and CyberKnife®—as minimally invasive treatments for previously untreatable brain and spinal tumors. UH is one of the first medical centers in Ohio to establish a Brain Attack Team for stroke victims that is available 24 hours a day.

The Neurological Institute's specialist team is recognized internationally for superior expertise in areas such as dementia, stroke, movement disorders such as Parkinson's disease, neuromuscular disorders including ALS, spinal neurosurgery, benign and malignant brain tumors, and cognitive disorders such as Alzheimer's disease. The Neurological Institute's Epilepsy Center is designated as a Level IV unit, the highest designation recognized by the National Association of Epilepsy Centers. The UH stroke program is certified as a Primary Stroke Center by The Joint Commission.

UH's neurosciences program is currently ranked among the top 35 in the country. The UH Neurological Institute's record of achievement to date illustrates how an interdisciplinary team of specialists can bring together the expertise of surgeons, physicians, researchers and educators to provide effective, high-quality care that is tailored specifically to the needs of the individual patient.

CANCER CARE

University Hospitals Ireland Cancer Center is proud to lead the region in innovative cancer treatment. Our day-to-day mission is to pursue curative therapies by rapidly translating scientific discoveries to advance patient care.

As concrete evidence of our commitment, UH announced plans to construct a new, freestanding cancer hospital. Tripling currently available cancer-care space, the 300,000-square-foot, 150-bed facility will house the diagnostic, medical, surgical, infusion and radiation therapy services provided by the more than 300 professionals who comprise our 11 multidisciplinary treatment teams. The new hospital will include a healing garden featuring colorful and aromatic plants, water features and landscaping, for patients and families coping with the challenges of cancer treatment.

Designated as a Comprehensive Cancer Center by the National Cancer Institute (NCI), the Ireland Cancer Center provides patients with access to more

than 300 clinical trials. UH is one of eight facilities nationwide to have been awarded National Institutes of Health funds to study new NCI-approved drug treatments for early phase clinical trials. Unlike most cancer-care facilities, we do not delay the use of clinical trials until after standard therapies have failed, but instead offer them early in the treatment planning stage as appropriate. Almost 20 percent of our patients are enrolled in clinical trials – five times the national average.

As part of our community outreach efforts in 2006, the Ireland Cancer Center launched the Healing & Hope quarterly education series in conjunction with our community-based centers. Throughout the year, UH offered more than 225 free community programs ranging from cancer detection, prevention and treatment to symptom management and survivorship. The new Center for Survivors of Breast Cancer was created to address the challenges that breast cancer survivors face after treatment ends – specifically, strategies and treatments for medical and psychosocial survivorship issues.

UH is devoting enormous resources to recruiting the most talented professionals in the country. Recent additions to the Ireland Cancer Center staff include Julian A. Kim, MD, as Chief - Division of Surgical Oncology; John Letterio, MD, as Chief - Division of Pediatric Hematology & Oncology; and Alvin H. Schmaier, MD, as Chief - Division of Hematology & Oncology.

All Ireland Cancer Center faculty contribute to cancer research in basic or clinical science as members of the Case Comprehensive Cancer Center. Ireland Cancer Center constantly provides the highest quality of care to our patients while continually discovering the next advances in cancer treatment.

SURGICAL CARE

Surgical patients come to University Hospitals for access to high-quality care that utilizes the most innovative technologies and the most advanced procedures. UH specialists, for example, have wide-ranging expertise in minimally invasive surgical techniques, which can provide less painful procedures, more rapid recovery and a faster return to normal activities. In fact, UH is a regional and national center for post-graduate training in minimally invasive techniques.

A case in point is the Division of Colorectal Surgery's expertise in transanal endoscopic microsurgery, the most advanced minimally invasive procedure available for the treatment of low rectal cancer. In conjunction with the Ireland Cancer Center, the Department of Urology is evaluating such new techniques as cryoablation of prostate cancer and both cryoablation and radiosurgery for kidney tumors.

A related initiative announced during the year was Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital's new \$10 million Center for Minimally Invasive Pediatric Surgery, which holds the potential to dramatically improve the lives of children in our region and around the world. The program received the support of The Cleveland Foundation in the form of a \$1.5 million gift – the largest award ever given to a hospital by the Foundation.

In October 2006, UH Case Medical Center received the American Society for Bariatric Surgery

(ASBS) "Center of Excellence" designation, recognizing programs with a demonstrated track record of favorable outcomes in such bariatric procedures as gastric bypass, laparoscopic adjustable band and biliopancreatic diversion surgery – methods that have resulted in durable weight loss.

A range of women's health issues is now addressed in the Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology's new Women's Pelvic Health Center. Center director Sangeeta Mahajan, MD, is one of no more than 1,000 fellowship-trained urogynecologists in the country with specific expertise in reconstructive surgery to correct disorders and dysfunctions of the pelvic floor.

In an October symposium, Bahman Guyuron, MD, Chief of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at UH Case Medical Center and an internationally recognized leader in the field of plastic surgery, conducted the world's first live surgical demonstration course for surgeons and neurologists around the country for his revolutionary treatment of migraine headaches. With a team of neurologists, Dr. Guyuron has performed his groundbreaking surgical treatment successfully on more than 700 patients suffering from frontal, temple, occipital and behind-the-eye migraine.

ORTHOPAEDIC

The Orthopaedics Department this year marked a century of service within University Hospitals Case Medical Center as a nationally recognized comprehensive care program for the full range of musculoskeletal problems, including foot and ankle, hand, shoulder and upper extremity, total joint replacement, pediatric, oncology, trauma and sports medicine.

In addition, we are an international leader in the creation of groundbreaking patient-friendly surgical procedures for problems of the cervical, thoracic and lumbar spine. Our extraordinary clinical expertise in complex cases has drawn many patients requiring revision surgeries to address problems that were not remediated in procedures at other institutions. And our prominence in this increasingly important specialty was recognized internationally at the December 2005 meeting of the prestigious Cervical Spine Research Society, where we earned the top three awards for research studies that are now being translated into improvements in patient care.

Our reputation for outstanding research is reflected in our National Institutes of Health funding, which has ranked first among all orthopaedic departments in the nation seven times in the last decade. A multidisciplinary team of UH physicians and researchers whose work is improving the polyethylene used in hip-replacement surgery received the 2006 Otto Aufranc Award from the Hip Society, a group of internationally renowned orthopaedic surgeons. The team's study is part of our larger effort to develop new prosthetic devices that expand the range of age groups eligible for lifestyle-preserving joint-replacement surgery.

Extending the reach of the Shoulder & Elbow Division this year is Reuben Gobezie, MD, who brings expertise in the innovative "reverse total-shoulder replacement" surgical procedure. Dr. Gobezie's experience with this breakthrough technique affords a new option for patients with severe shoulder arthritis. Dr. Gobezie is also a leader in the field of Musculoskeletal Proteomics, a new area of research that has already identified a biomarker profile that may improve treatments for early and late osteoarthritis.

Patient-centered care is the driving concept behind the new Orthopaedic Center at UH Geauga Medical Center, which opened in May. Patients benefit from both state-of-the-art clinical techniques and a dedicated 16-bed inpatient center whose hotel-like private rooms and concierge services facilitate rapid recovery. The program has proved so successful that orthopedic procedures at Geauga have increased by 11 percent in little more than a year.

Designated a Center of Excellence by the National Spine Institute, the UH program offers patients care from specialists in a range of related disciplines, as well as access to such state-of-the-art radiosurgical treatment options as CyberKnife® and GammaKnife® technologies.

WOMEN'S AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Renewed recognition of Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital's status among our peers came in *U.S. News & World Report* magazine's annual ratings of America's Best Hospitals, in which Rainbow was once again named the No. 1 children's hospital in the Midwest while rising to the No. 4 rank in the entire U.S. In addition, we were once again rated among the Top Ten children's hospitals in the country in *Child* magazine's 2007 biennial survey.

The expertise and experience of Rainbow clinicians and researchers makes our institution a pace-setting national and world leader in such areas as cystic fibrosis, congenital heart surgery, endocrinology and diabetes, neurosurgery and orthopedics. Rainbow researchers in the Children's Asthma Center are lead investigators in studies conducted under the Inner City Asthma Consortium, a \$55 million program of the National Institutes of Health.

In neonatal patient care, Rainbow has been a global leader in treatment, research and physician training for two decades. The successful outcomes we see every day in our Level III neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) are due in part to our close relationship with UH MacDonald Women's Hospital, the region's referral center for high-risk deliveries. MacDonald is one of only 12 full-service women's hospitals in the country and the only hospital in Ohio dedicated to women's health.

To provide future generations of tiny patients high levels of quality care, Rainbow's new NICU—one element of our Vision 2010 strategic plan—will incorporate state-of-the-art monitoring systems and an in-unit surgical suite. Private patient rooms will replace the current multi-patient nurseries, and bedside space will be available for parents who wish to sleep near their babies.

Acutely ill or injured children will share the benefit of Rainbow's new emergency department, which will be part of, but entirely separate from, the new \$50 million Center for Emergency Medicine. A family-oriented facility, the new emergency area will improve diagnosis and treatment capabilities with the most up-to-date equipment. Ample room for physicians to do their jobs and comfortable surroundings for patients and worried parents will add to the environment of care.

THE AHUJA FAMILY MAKES HISTORIC GIFT

The perfect ending to an extraordinary year came on December 12, 2006. UH celebrated the largest single donation in its 140-year history—a \$30-million gift in support of Vision 2010 from Cleveland entrepreneur Monte Ahuja, his wife, Usha, and their daughters Ritu and Manisha—who is married to Neil Sethi—and their grandson, Rohan. More than 700 guests gathered for an unprecedented holiday celebration at Severance Hall where Thomas F. Zenty III, UH president and chief executive officer, made the historic announcement.

"Monte and Usha have generously supported University Hospitals with their time and talents for many years," said Mr. Zenty. "Through this gift, Monte and Usha are demonstrating not only their dedication to University Hospitals, but to the economic vitality of this region and to maintaining the highest caliber health care for the people of Northeast Ohio."

In recognition of the Ahuja family's extraordinary generosity, UH will name the future 600-bed east side hospital in Beachwood—The Ahuja Medical Center. Since UH unveiled plans for the expanded east side medical campus and new hospital in May 2006, community leaders have hailed the project as a catalyst for economic growth and an opportunity for Greater Cleveland to reaffirm its national leadership position in the health care industry.

"I can think of no better investment than University Hospitals' Vision 2010. The vision is more than buildings; it is a promise to the people of Northeast Ohio—and beyond—that UH is here to serve them for generations to come," said Mr. Ahuja, who is Vice Chairman of the UH Board of Directors and who led the Board task force that developed Vision 2010. "In many ways, my life is an example of the great American dream. I consider myself very fortunate to be so successful in business and to have such a wonderful family, and I want to give back to the community."

Born and raised in India, Monte Ahuja earned a BS in mechanical engineering before emigrating to the United States in 1969. As a financially struggling student, he earned an MS in mechanical engineering at The Ohio State University in 1970 and an MBA at Cleveland State University.

Upon graduation, Mr. Ahuja established a small distribution company that eventually grew into a global success. Today this business, now known as Transtar Industries Inc., is the leading worldwide distributor of original equipment quality transmission parts to the motor vehicle repair industry with annual revenues of more than \$250 million.

Usha Ahuja, a gold medalist for mathematics in India, has taught mathematics at several universities for nearly 20 years while also serving as a business partner and confidante to her husband. Mrs. Ahuja is currently a member of the UH Board's Development Committee.

RAINBOW FOUNDATION RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS MATHER AWARD

University Hospitals awarded its highest philanthropic honor to a group dedicated for 120 years to the health and well-being of Cleveland's children. The Rainbow Babies & Children's Foundation was the 2006 winner of the esteemed Samuel Mather Award for philanthropy at UH. The award, named for one of UH's earliest supporters, celebrates the exceptional generosity and civic vision of benefactors who have had a lasting and profound impact on UH.

The Rainbow Babies & Children's Foundation and its predecessor organization have made it their mission to garner financial, political, corporate and community support for the hospital. In 2006, the Foundation awarded Rainbow \$20.6 million, the largest single gift in Rainbow's history, in support of our Vision 2010 strategic plan.

"We are proud and pleased to continue the outreach efforts started so long ago by our sisters in service, and we are deeply touched by this prestigious honor from University Hospitals. The award celebrates the hundreds of women who have been a part of the Foundation over the past 120 years," said Julie A. Raskind, president, Rainbow Babies & Children's Foundation.

The Foundation's gift—announced in March 2006—will support the construction of a new Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (\$5 million), as well as to support Child Life funding (\$7 million) and additional clinical programs and new initiatives (\$3.6 million). The remaining \$5 million is earmarked for an "Endowed Chair Challenge" in which the Foundation contributes \$500,000 for every \$1 million donated to establish a new endowed chair. The challenge enables Rainbow to retain and recruit the best talent in pediatric medicine and will result in 10 new fully funded endowed chairs at \$1.5 million each.

THE NEW CANCER HOSPITAL

SCHNEIDER GIFT PROVIDES HEALING GARDEN

The future free-standing cancer hospital at UH Case Medical Center will offer patients not only advanced cancer care but a beautiful, life-affirming healing garden. Funded by a generous \$2.75-million gift from Bob and Cindy Schneider, this new therapeutic space will help patients and their families cope with the challenges of cancer treatment.

The Schneiders made the donation in memory of Bob's parents, Albert and Mary Schneider, who both died of cancer. The Schneider Healing Garden will offer patients a mentally and physically restorative retreat within the new 150-bed cancer hospital and outpatient cancer care facility. Bob and Cindy are members of the University Hospitals Diamond Legacy Society and Ireland Cancer Center's National Cancer Leadership Council. This Council is comprised of volunteer leaders—both locally and nationally—who serve as advocates for the Ireland Cancer Center.

HONORING GEORGE M. HUMPHREY, II

University Hospitals designated George M. Humphrey, II as its first Lifetime Director for his more than 25 years of outstanding service to UH. The award was presented December 1 to Mr. Humphrey, who retired from the Board, and coincided with the announcement of a challenge grant and a chair, both named in his honor. The Humphrey Challenge will provide \$500,000 for every \$1 million donated, which will lead to eight new chairs in the Neurological Institute. And, in recognition of the significant role that Mr. Humphrey has played in continuing his family's legacy of support, the Humphrey Family and the Board of Directors of UHCMC established the George M. Humphrey, II Chair in Neurology. A Cleveland businessman, philanthropist, and member of a storied Cleveland family, Mr. Humphrey first joined the UH Board of Directors in 1980. During his board tenure, he led several important multi-million-dollar fundraising campaigns, including a four-year campaign beginning in 1991, which surpassed its \$40 million goal and raised \$61 million. It was UH's most successful fundraising campaign at that time.

THE PRENTISS FOUNDATION SUPPORTS NICU AND NEUROLOGICAL INSTITUTE

"The plans that UH has outlined for the future of the hospital system in its Vision 2010 growth strategy are among the best we have ever seen," said Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation trustees in making this gift. "We hope our philanthropic investment will inspire others in the community to step up and join us in supporting University Hospitals in its efforts to raise healthcare to new heights in Northeast Ohio."

FOWLER GIFT TO ADVANCE ADOLESCENT AND YOUNG ADULT CANCER RESEARCH

Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital, in partnership with Ireland Cancer Center, received a \$1.5-million gift in support of teen and young adult cancer from Char and Chuck Fowler in memory of their daughter, Angie, whom they lost to melanoma when she was 14, 25 years ago.

The gift funds the first endowed chair in the U.S. for adolescent and young adult (AYA) cancer, and the Angie Fowler Adolescent and Young Adult Treatment Suite in the new cancer outpatient space being built at Rainbow. The Angie Fowler Chair in Adolescent and Young Adult Cancer Research will enable

the recruitment of a nationally recognized physician-scientist with expertise in AYA cancer, and will generate annual income to support the chair holder's patient care programs, clinical innovations and medical research.

The Fowlers' gift is being matched with \$500,000 from the Rainbow Babies & Children's Foundation, as part of a challenge grant issued in 2006 to fund 10 new endowed chairs at the hospital. With the help of the Fowlers' attorney, Marcia J. Over the past two years, UH has seen an increase in generosity from donors through annual and special giving resulting in a greater number of donors and overall support. CENTER FOR EMERGENCY MEDICINE

O'NEILL FOUNDATION GIVES TO PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY MEDICINE AT UH

Compelled by the need to provide the community's children with an emergency care environment that meets the unique needs of our youngest patients, The William J. and Dorothy K. 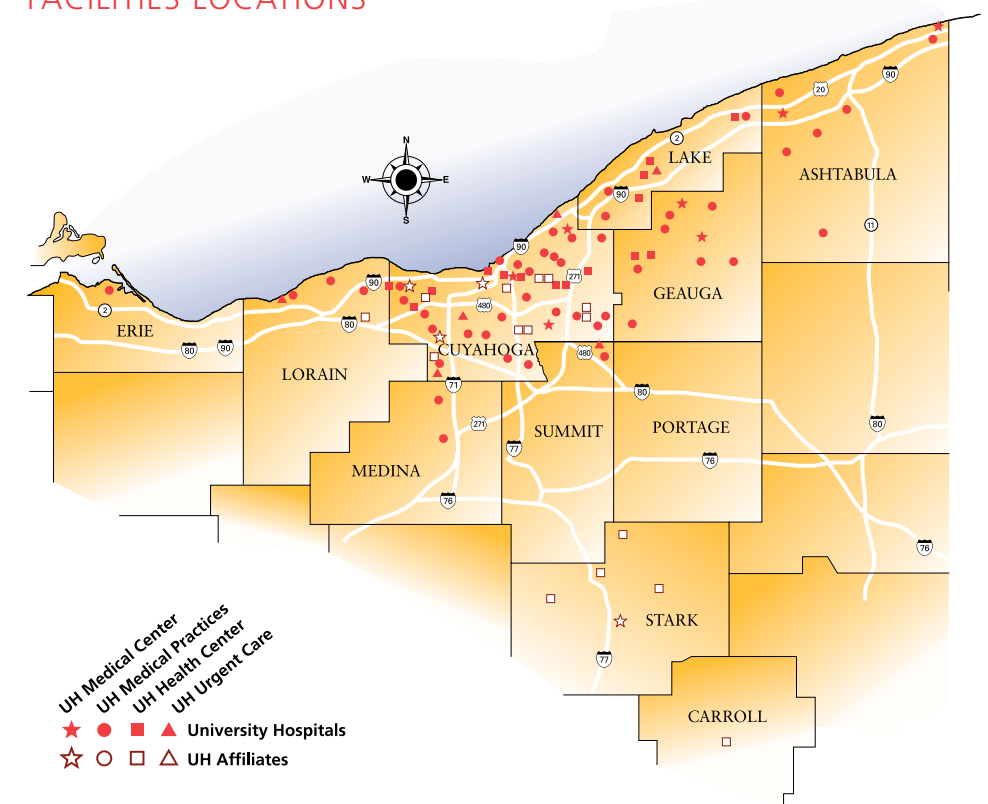
HORVITZ FAMILY SUPPORTS PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY MEDICINE
