Center of Outpatient Education Track

Program Description

Thank you for your interest in the Center of Outpatient Education (COE) track! This track was started at our VA Primary Care Clinic in 2011 to provide a robust outpatient clinic experience to residents with a focus on training in leadership and quality improvement (QI). The residents in this track complete a longitudinal QI project throughout their residency that is presented locally and nationally. For clinic, residents are paired in teams and together function as the primary care provider for a panel of patients at the Louis Stokes VA Medical Center. Residents work seamlessly with nurses, social workers, psychologists, and pharmacists to provide a patient-centered approach to care.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I apply to both the Categorical and COE tracks?

Yes, many people choose to rank both tracks.

Do residents in the COE program receive adequate training in subspecialty and inpatient medicine?

Absolutely! Participants of the program receive the same amount of time on the inpatient wards at UH as categorical residents. In fact, they are indistinguishable from categorical residents when not participating in the COE block.

How many residents are in the COE track?

Each year, we match 6 applicants from University Hospitals and 6 applicants from Cleveland Clinic Foundation for a combined total of 12 residents/class.

What is a typical weekly schedule during COE?

Residents rotate through COE during four 12-week blocks over the course of their 3 years of residency (1 block during PGY-1, 2 blocks during PGY-2, and 1 block during PGY-3). Below is a sample schedule of a typical week on COE. During the elective blocks, residents can choose to go to *any* subspecialty clinic at the Cleveland Clinic or the VA.
