Selectives:

Selectives are required rotations that must be completed prior to graduation. Senior residents may adjust the timing of their selective rotations to align with personal interests and career goals. For example, a resident may choose to forgo an elective block during PGY2 to complete a selective, thereby allowing for an additional elective block during PGY3.

- Cardiology – 1.5 blocks
- Endocrinology – 0.5 block
- Gastroenterology – 0.5 block (PTO restricted during entire block)
- Geriatrics – 0.5 block
- Hematology Oncology – 0.5 block (PTO restricted during initial 0.5 block)**
- Infectious Disease – 0.5 block - needs
- Nephrology – 0.5 block (PTO restricted during initial 0.5 block)**
- Neurology – 0.5 block (PTO restricted during initial 0.5 block)**
- Pulmonology – 0.5 block
- Rheumatology – 0.5 block

Electives:

Electives may include any of the above rotations, as well as—but not limited to—Allergy and Immunology, Radiology, Wound Care, Psychiatry, Hospital Medicine, Research, and Hepatology.

Note: This list of electives is not comprehensive; please contact the program coordinator if you are interested in a rotation that is not included

All elective rotations must be pre-approved by the rotation's preceptor, the Program Director, and Program Coordinator.

*1 block = 4 weeks

**If a resident elects to spend more time on this selective than is required, paid time off (PTO) may be permitted. For example, if a resident chooses to spend a full block on Neurology, they may be allowed to take time off in accordance with the PTO policy
